

What you learn:

1. Year One –

Residential and Commercial Plumbing topics presented, basic plumbing principles, common codes, brazing safety, water heaters, plumbing rough-in practices and career path potential, and OSHA safety training

2. Year Two –

Builds on fundamentals of year one, piping materials, water sources, potable water distribution, cross-connections protections and additional water heater educations. Code knowledge expanded

3. Year Three –

Basic installation practices, blueprint reading, National Fuel Gas Code, surveying, math and science of plumbing, water treatment, trench safety, electrical controls, wiring

4. Year Four –

Covers residential, commercial, industrial and institutional aspects of plumbing systems, service and repair, installation, heating systems and further exposure to major codes

Did you know?

- The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics expects about 26 percent growth for plumbers between 2010 and 2020, which is higher growth than the average of 14 percent expected among all occupations.

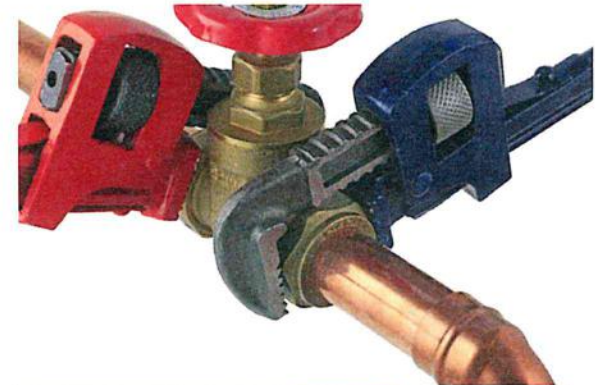
